A BIT OF HISTORY

Formerly titled Bush Terminal, Industry City is a collection of enormous warehouses in Sunset Park, Brooklyn, located on what was once part of the waterfront's intermodal shipping, warehouse, and manufacturing complex. Like Chelsea Market, each warehouse still pays homage to its industrial roots with exposed piping and heavy iron doors.

It is a one-stop destination of experiences, eateries, events and everything in between. An historic intermodal city, built on 35 acres of repurposed industrial space. The waterfront green spaces, immersive retail, and public art installations make for an entire day of discovery. The diverse mix of culture and locally born businesses is as authentic a New York experience as it gets. No visit to Industry City is ever the same.

3 COOL THINGS TO DO AFTER YOUR ENGLISH CLASS

3. After class, walk up to the 36th street and take the N and then the R to Court Street. From here, it is the perfect location to explore another great neighborhood, Brooklyn Heights. Don't miss great views of the city from the Brooklyn Heights Promenade, best seen at the end of the day!
