### A BIT OF HISTORY

In November 2014, Pier A opened to the public for the first time in its 128-year history, following an extensive restoration led by the Battery Park City Authority. In partnership with the City of New York, the Authority funded the renovation of the Pier's structure, which was critical to the preservation of this important landmark. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Pier A stands today as Manhattan's oldest remaining pier.

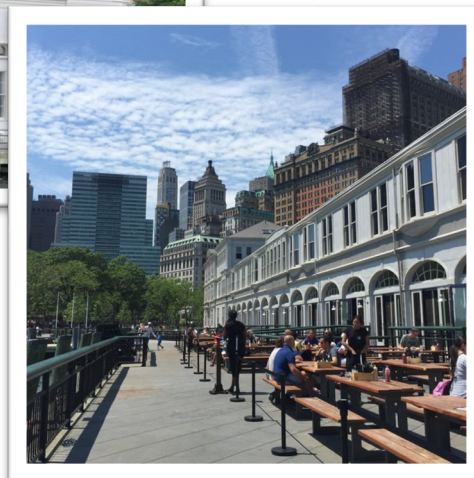

### 3 COOL THINGS TO DO AFTER YOUR ENGLISH CLASS

1. The **National Museum of the American Indian–New York**, is located at the Alexander Hamilton U.S. Custom House in Manhattan, New York City. As part of the Smithsonian Institution, the center showcases contemporary and historical exhibits of art and artifacts by and about Native Americans. Originally founded by George Heye in 1916 as the Museum of the American Indian, it joined the national museum and the Smithsonian in 1987.
2. The **Statue of Liberty** (*Liberty Enlightening the World*; French: *La Liberté éclairant le monde*) is a colossal neoclassical sculpture on Liberty Island in New York Harbor in New York City, in the United States. The copper statue, a gift from the people of France, was designed by French sculptor Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi and its metal framework was built by Gustave Eiffel. The statue was dedicated on October 28, 1886.
3. **Empire Outlets** is New York City's premier outdoor shopping and dining center. With its picture-perfect views of lower Manhattan and access to some of the best deals, Empire Outlets is unlike any other shopping destination in the city. It's just steps from the Staten Island Ferry.
