A BIT OF HISTORY

Located in Hudson River Park between Gansevoort Street and Little West 12th Street, Gansevoort Peninsula delivers a wide array of spaces for lounging, fitness, and fun. Built on solid ground visitors will find a resilient southern edge that provides direct access to the Hudson River for non-motorized boats and stunning views of the river, the lower Manhattan skyline and *Day's End*, a monumental, site-specific sculpture by David Hammons donated to the park by the Whitney Museum of American Art in 2021. Swimming is not permitted.

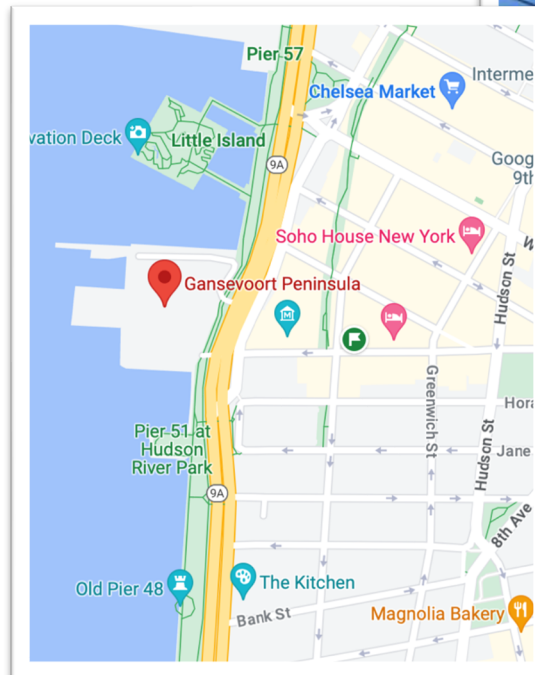

3 COOL THINGS TO DO AFTER YOUR ENGLISH CLASS

1. This is a great opportunity to explore **Little Island**. It's a new public park where all New Yorkers and visitors can experience nature and art in a unique urban oasis on the Hudson River.
2. Alternatively head to the **Whitney Museum**. It focuses on collecting and preserving 20th- and 21st-century American art. Its permanent collection, spanning the late-19th century to the present, comprises more than 25,000 paintings, sculptures, drawings, prints, photographs, films, videos, and artifacts of new media by more than 3,500 artists.
3. **Chelsea Market** is a world-famous food hall in the heart of New York City's Meatpacking District. Commonly featured in walking and food tours, the market has an array of dining options that draw both locals and travelers. Set aside a couple of hours to conquer the corridors of this sprawling indoor marketplace. Many travelers load up on fresh produce, prime cuts of meat, artisanal cheeses, and even imported Italian dry goods.
